If your definition of a dead forum is that your questions are not answered within few hours then yes, this forum is pretty dead.

Anyway, if the due date is not set for the task it's impossible to know on which days it should repeat. So, if you want to create a recurring task you must define some due date for it.

You can define the tray icon actions in the advanced skin settings so you can e.g. make the windows to hide when you double click on the icon.

Let me just say I'm very sorry for being rude or coming off as an ass, it's just this 1 thing would bring this program full circle, I know I'm not the only one that wants a to-do list that will function as such.

I'm well aware of the options and what they do, I'm very thorough with something before I ever come asking/bitching anywhere. ;P

It's very clear this to-do list will not do what I want at this point with out some further coding. I've already stated what's necessary for a to-do list to do! lol

1. Only show tasks for today's date, showing up at the start time, turning red at the due time, "hiding" at the completed time.
2. Reoccurring tasks should be the same as above, except they should return the next day at their start time.
3. Most importantly, only today's tasks should show! I have a very cluttered to-do list because it shows tasks that are weeks away! :(

it sounds like you should be using events instead of tasks...

1. tasks don't show up at the start time, they show up at the start date so you know what you have to do that day. they remain visible until they are marked as complete. they do not automatically turn become marked as complete after the due time. instead, they change to overdue. depending on the skin, overdue items might look different, but it's an option that the skinner has to add. tasks disappear when deleted, or if you set them to hide when complete, they disappear when marked as completed.

2. returning at their start time? that's not the nature of this program, nor is it the nature of "to do" items. they return either immediately, or on the day they start, depending on how you set things up (see #3)

3. right-click on a todo item like i suggested in my previous post, then choose "hide upcoming tasks". that way, only today's items will show.

that is how rainlendar works. if it's not how you want it to work, then perhaps you need to write your own program :S
