Changes:

- o It's now possible to use math expressions in the xml format skins in attributes which have integers as the type.
- o Added possibility to define width for each character in a bitmap font. The bitmap font can be used most places as normal fonts.
- o Increased the Rainlendar_ShowMenu() index range to 10000. It can now also contain submenus.
- o Added a copygroup item for the xml skins which duplicates the items it contains. The position of the items can change in each copy.
- o Added possibility to rotate the bitmap elements as they are loaded.
- o New calendar windows for Shadow4: Grid Calendar, Vertical Line Calendar and Horizontal Line Calendar.
- o The tooltip shouldn't open anymore over other applications.
- o Recurring Outlook appointments with multiple exceptions were not always shown correctly. Fixed.
- o The Rainlendar's data stored as a Remember The Milk's notes was sometimes multiplied. Fixed.

garbanzo, the syntax for the alphabet is "=;=;=;..." (i.e "A=10;B=6;C=8;"). Special letters like ';' which would mess up the format need to be defined as unicode (e.g. "U+3B"). The bitmap font image will be automatically divided into as many parts as there are letters in the alphabet and the characters must be equally spaced in the image. That means that if for example the width (or height) is 300px and you have 30 letters in the alphabet each character will take 10px in the image no matter what you define as its width in the alphabet attribute.

The Manager is empty (no items at all) when disconnected. The .ics (both GCal & RTM) are inside the backups folder, somehow rainlendar doesn't seem to pick up RTM.

1. The string for "Suppress alarm" is translated wrongly in German. In the english version it is fine.

2. With the english language enabled the option for "Suppress errors" is remembered (the calendar is set to read only). Strangely after I am able to switch back to german even though I deleted the languagefile from the programdirectory. And even stranger is that now the setting for "suppress errors" is remembered. What is going on? May be Rainlendar found another language-file somewhere else?

3. Moreover I saw that the bug concerning a dualscreen setup is also not fixed, where the tooltips' position is calculated wrongly (see attached picture) if the resolution is not identical and the two screens are aligned as seen in the screenshot.

I could not reproduce it with Beta 80, but it seems to work fine in Beta 81 and the strings are even translated now.

I of course also would gladly test a debug edition, if it helps. May be you could at a debug-information that puts the position of the cursor and the position of the tooltip to the log-file.

May be something like this goes wrong:

Cursor-position is x (vertically)

Monitoroffset is 100

Instead of calculating x-100 it calculates x+100 (or the other way round). Could that be?
