Then I have no idea what could cause this. I'm using a 3rd party library to access the network and I don't know the details how things are implemented in it. You could try to check if there are any proxy related settings that are set differently in your computer than in your colleagues' computer.

You could also try to "Reset all settings" from the advanced options and reconfigure Rainlendar again to make sure there aren't any old settings e.g. from the previous versions which might cause conflicts.
