- From the FAQ:

How can I install skins or languages?

Written by Kimmo Pekkola

There are two kinds of skins for Rainlendar: The old skins which are usually distributed as a zip or rar archive and the new skins which have .r2skin extension.

To install old skins you need to uncompress the skin into the Rainlendar's skins-folder. Make sure that no extra folders are created when you unzip the archive. There must be only one subfolder under the skins-folder where the skin's ini-file(s) are located. After you refresh the calendar the skin should appear in the skin list. If that doesn't happen check the Rainlendar's log file for possible errors.

To install new skins (.r2skin) you can just drag and drop the file over one of the Rainlendar's windows and it will be installed automatically. In Windows you can install the skin also just by double clicking it.

---

The languages (.r2lang) can be installed the same way as the new skins (i.e. by double clicking or dropping).

- From the Help-file:

Skins  
Windows: Just double click the skin file (.r2skin) and it gets installed automatically. Or drop the file over one of the Rainlendar's windows.  
Uninstall: You can uninstall the skin manually by deleting it from Rainlendar's skins-folder. Do not delete a skin that you are currently using. The old Rainlendar skins can be uninstalled the same way except that instead of deleting the file you need to delete the folder where the skin's files are.

Note that the skin is not visible in the options dialog until you refresh Rainlendar.

- check: Options > Advanced > SkinLanguage  
Click on 'Default' and open the dropdownlist  
Is it possible to select 'Danish' here?

I asked you again, did you download/installed the right skin file? The one with all the foreign languages and not only the English language? It's at the bottom of the language page of the website (follow the link here to download directly):

I think you renamed it the other way round: the original name is 'Shadow4.r2skin-addon' and you renamed it to "Shadow4.zip". Is this right? If so:

Could you remember I asked you in one of my first replies:

"Do you ever read a FAQ or a Help-file, before posting your questions in a forum?"

Where did you read that you have to rename the skin-file into a zip-file? After installation of Rainlendar there are 3 file-extensions '.r2skin-addon', '.r2skin' and '.r2lang' registered to Rainlendar, so if you execute such a file (by double clicking in Windows Explorer or draging the file over a Rainlendar window) with one of these file-extensions the installation is started automatically.

So I suggest to try it again with the original (not renamed) skin-file: Shadow4.r2skin-addon.
