First of all, I apologize for my poor english :blush:

I have some suggestions to propose :

- with the new version, it's possible to define a snooze between 1 minute and 2 hours. It's cool and it's why I have finally installed Rainlendar on my computer (I used Active Desktop Calendar before). It would be great to have a textbox to enter the delay we want and a combobox for the unit (minute, hour, day, week). I have to choose 1 day, 1 week, 4 hours, ...

- it would be great to have an option to make the alarm window not always at the top

- I need to define tasks with a recurrence and not only events: every day, at 5pm, I have to do an administration task for example.

- I need to define alarms for tasks or events without seeing them in the tasks or events lists on the desktop. A checkbox to say visible or not in the list would be great.
