All events which are stored to a network or 3rd party calendar (Google, RTM, Outlook) will have the text in front of the summary text if the license is not installed. If the Rainlendar's about dialog doesn't show you as the licensed user you need to download the license file again from the link that was sent to you when you bought the license and reinstall it.

License must be properly installed to get rid of the tag. Rainlendar will display events from your Google calendar if you have it properly configured (google calendar was created). You can also have events stored to a local calendar (Default). If you create an event and assign it to both the Google calendar and Default it will show up twice. If you just add it to the Google calendar it will show up once. You can then add it to Default and it will continue to only show up once.

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
