I'm trying to do a circular calendar, so i'm using layout="FREE". I've already made it, but i can't show the weekdays in a inner/outer circle.

Is there a way to locate them according to the day location or are they fixed only in the other layouts?

EDIT:

Also, it doesn't show "edit event" with right-click. And if i choose add event, it doesn't matter what day i select, it always shows today.

It's only one XML file using the Shadow4 skin. If i finish it, you can add it... B)

I think to be good enough.

Could the coords (for calendar and for weekdays) be calculated like x,y,w and h? I mean, w="Calendar_width% - 5" with Calendar_width% = 500 is parsed to x="495" (at least, it works with this calculations). In that way, i can "rotate" the days (like a dial) to show today on top, although, i'm not sure if i can use %d on the formulas. Maybe if %today_number% = %d, is this valid?

As once told you, i know nothing about Lua, but with my little skill from VB, VB.NET and C i think i've made something. (With a help from your previous scripts :P of course, and Wikipedia for weekday calculation).

I don't know if it's slow to refresh..., because when i try to change "x" and "y" debug says:

So, i had to change "text" instead.

Now the problem is how i know when a day has an event and how to show its icons? (change color will be easy)

And make `dayCount = dayCount + 1`, to create a space between 1 and 31 (because is annoying to see the two days together, but that was my fault).

I been looking the event icons these days and they seems to be "a little bit to the left".

If i hide the section, the icons goes inside (CENTER) the days with events.If i hide all items and only left , the icons show in the BOTTOM-RIGHT of the day with eventWith a specific font size (with BORDER effect) they looks better, just like in the Calendar view.
Changing the offset field moves the day numbers, not the icons.

The problem is caused by the bitmap numbers which have additional padding on the sides. This makes the day area larger than what is covered by the numbers. I think I'll have to add new attributes for the single day area.

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
