First, the file must be saved as *.r2skin-addon, I think you have do it.

Then, if expand Shadow4, have you see any new windows at "Available skins" ? hmm, I think you also have.

You said: "but when I have tried to use it, it appears with the name: Text file, and this is what I get a box with the text: Text file: no file given...".

I think you are activate "Text File" window, not "World Time" window. Please try again, and activate the correct window "World Time".

In that case I dont think it will make the change automatically, because here in Spain we use the CET (Central European Time) that it is always UMT +1, but after the daylight saving change we use the CEST (Central European Summer Time) that it is always UMT +2, So I will have to make the change manually from CET to CEST...

Maybe if at least the +1, +2 or -1, -2, etc.. option was linked to the local time instead to the UMT, it will work, supossing all the countries make the daylight saving change the same day. That I guess most of them make, because it is defined being the last sunday of March and the last Sunday of October, at less here and in most European countries if not all of them.

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
