I entered the start of Daylight Savings as 2:00 AM on March 13th and what came up was 1:00 AM as the start.

Fiddling around with the time for this event I found I could enter 1:00 AM or 3:00 AM or anything other than 2:00 AM and they would all work fine.

Does anyone know why 2:00 AM will not record correctly.
