# Rainlendar 2.2 Review

I have been using Rainlendar 0.22 since it came out. I really enjoyed it and appreciated how it simplified and organized by days. I found about version 2.2 today and become excited about the new features it may hold. Perhaps I expected too much. Here are some of the problems I've encountered.

#### **PROBLEMS**

# 1. The learning curve:

Version 0.22 was quite easy to learn. I learned it quite well within minutes. Version 2.2 just takes way too long to adapt to. Too many features, lack of sufficient organization, and lack of customization than version 0.22.

#### 2. Menus and access to Options:

There are only 2 ways to access the options - which tries to control every aspect of Rainlendar with a poor job. When right clickling on the Rainlendar to access the menues, it takes correct precision to get it. Double clicking to edit events can be a workout too.

#### 3. Locking windows in place:

I liked being able to lock the positions of individual windows by simple right cliking on them like in 0.22. I hate going into the options and having to press OK.

#### 4. Pressing OK for every single change in options!

This is very very very very annoying! I would like to see at least an "Apply" button, so we can see how our changes appear without closing the options dialog box.

#### 5. Lack of customization:

I had to go to the Help file to find out how to apply various icons. But being version 2.2, I would think that they'd find some simpler way for users to customize rather than to edit the actual .xml file.

#### 6. Options -> Skins -> Settings

This feature is quite impressive, I admit. But I wish the author could have given more control to the user. (e.g. deciding how many days should the Events List show) Also, this is a great place to put an "Apply" button so we can see our changes WITHOUT closing the options dialog box!

### 7. Scaling

Try to scale your Digiclock to 120%. What a mess! :sick:

#### WHAT I LIKE SO FAR

- 1. The pop-up bubbles that come out when you hover over an event or to-do item.
- 2. The different calendar is clever, though it can be cleaned up a bit.
- 3. Easy to edit tables to change parameters like in Options -> Advanced

#### WHAT I LIKE TO SEE

- 1. "Apply" button to allow us to see our changes w/out having to close options box.
- 2. Simpler way to change font size, type, and color, as well as simpler way to apply icons to categories and event types.
- 3. Tutorial to produce our own skins and parameters.

I beg to differ. Rainlendar was up an running with several skins, reading all my existing calendars, in a matter of minutes. Basic customisation was easy. Fair enough, I did waste half a day messing with the skin, and still haven't got it quite right, but that is my problem, and the basics was easy. And my changes very COOL, with limited effort.

One rarely sees software that allows for customisation to the extent that rainlendar does - in terms of interface. While it is true that one needs to dive into the .xml to make fundamental tweaks (and the whole thing can be quite confusing), it seems to me that the vast number of options are simply too complex to simplify. As for the number of days in the Events list - that is available from the options menu anyway.

What in the world? Rainlendar hogs up 12.5Megs of system memory - more than MS Word and my firewall... :sick: Resources could be an issue, haven't checked. Looked at my log, ini and skin file though, and the amounts of information read by Rainlendar is humongous. When I get time, I would like to make a very simplistic customisation to work from. I can spare 12,5 Meg as long as it isn't sluggish - and so far that has not been a problem, even with 7 different calendars. Sunbird on the other hand, allows for a coffee break trying to read the same files.

# WHAT I LIKE SO FAR WHAT I LIKE TO SEE

Yes, well, I also have things I like and things I might want changed. But my priorities would be different (as it would be for almost every user). Mine would be:

Copy tabular items from Manager,

Manager window that could also display in "normal month layout",

Someone to take the effort to make an ultra-simplistic skin,

An app that does the same for vCards that Rainlendar does for iCal (with support for GEO).

Trouble is that every user is different. All in all, I am amazed at how quickly Rainy implements design requests and bug fixes. Striking the balance of all different requests is an almost impossible task - and I cannot imagine doing it much better than how it is done now.

#### **RATING**

Version 0.22: 3.5/5:)

Version 2.2: 3/5 :unsure:

Mine would be a 4,5+/5 on the same scale. On the plus side:

multiple environments (Linux/Win) and easy to use with other iCal apps, amazing customisation - I have almost made my perfect interface, fast compared to the competition, simply very cool software with increadible user value, and obviously, killer app freeware.

Just a little nudge. Have to agree with okh on the review thing.

I do think you are off on the resource usage. I'm using a minimalistic skin & running at just over 6 meg's with the calendar, to do list, and event list open. Graphics are standard oem. To give an accurate comparison you'd need to say have three word documents open, etc. The more layers to be rendered obviously we increase the usage depending on your graphics card.

On an unrelated note.

I'm constantly running a .net app coming in between 600/900 kb's... I wouldn't have believed possible.

I used .22 and I ran through customizations, and I've been doing the same with 2.0. And I will say this .22 was not user friendly, it was a trick to customize and version 2 fallows in the same path.
