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The problem is entering the url in the URL field for New Events in Rainlendar not Outlook. It works ok in Build 114 but does not work in Build 115 forward so something changed around this time in Rainlendar that is causing the problem.

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What changed in build 115 was that the url field was disabled because it isn't supported by Outlook so you cannot use it in Rainlendar either if the event is going to be stored to Outlook.
