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I'm using the latest 2.10 Build 120 version, and the weather widget always shows "No Data" after an initial system boot.

When I refresh it some seconds later, it loads the weather.

The network-delay after boot-up in the advanced settings seem to be valid only for the calendar. When I enter a higher number, like 20000, the weather widget want to access the network just after Rainlendar had started, but network access from the calendar is delayed as planned.

Any solution to that?
