
Log Errors, Enumerating Files, Invalid Recurrence,

My system is WinXP. Rainlendar works but I get an error popup at start:

C:\Documents and Settings\SSJ\rainlendar2\rainlendar2.ini', line 2: '=' expected. which led me to look at the '--debug' log. It seems some of my errors are due to missing files in C:\Documents and Settings\SSJ\rainlendar2

C:\Documents and Settings\SSJ\rainlendar2 > Contains these files/folders: alarms.ini, Default.ics, license.r2lic, rainlendar2.ini, rainlendar2.log, randomseed, backups

C:\Program Files\rainlendar2 > Contains these folders: resources, scripts, skins, utils, locale, plugins

Should I move C:\Documents and Settings\SSJ\rainlendar2\ to Program Files (as suggested in the 'Where is Rainlendar's log file' FAQ?) Should I move all files or just rainlendar2.ini ? I like the idea of all rainlendar files being in one location.

The log also includes many errors like Invalid recurrence in component....
Should I do anything about these - or wait to see if moving the .ini file helps?

Which are the first lines in rainlendar2.ini?

If this file has something wrong, moving it will do nothing. (this is just for portable installation)

The rainlendar2.ini file store data as:

VariableName=ValueName

and your popup looks like is trying to say that an equal is missing in the second line.

If it was the case of a missing file, then is more likely to found "file not found" in the log.

About the "Invalid recurrence in component ..." could be a bad info or an unsupported event/task. Could you bring more details?

Your password is in the settings (it's encoded though) so it's not a good idea to post it publicly.

Anyway, there is some extra content in the ini file which doesn't come from Rainlendar and that creates the error. You can try to clean it manually but it will be easier just to reset all settings from the "Reset" button in the options and just enter your calendar settings again.
