
How to add an event??

Hello all,

Downloaded Rainlendar and installed it on my Fedora Core 6 Machine today (done upon the advice of a co-worker) ... one question .. how do you add a recurring event. It would appear to be a simple issue. Here, it would probably be much better if I explain the steps I am taking:

1. Right click on the desktop rainlendar calendar. (Actually I right click on the last day of this month, January 2007, since the last day of the month is the recurring day for my event that I would like to add)
2. The menu then appears afterward, I follow the "Add Event Link"
3. I fill out some information pertaining to the event on both the event-tab and recurrence-tab.
4. Once I believe I am finished entering in informaion. the okay button, the one you would normally click to submit that your done, never turns on. What I mean is, I can never press the "ok" because it appears to always be disabled.

Double check to make sure you have a calendar selected. On the main information page at the bottom there is a button that says calendar with a text box next to it. If the text box is empty you need to pick a calendar.

There should always be an "icalendars" option when you click the add button. You don't need to install icals, just tell it where you want it using the wizard.

Hello,

Here is my Solution:

To allow rainlendar and have SELinux enabled:

1. Goto: Administration -> Security Level and Firewall
2. Select: "SELinux" Tab
3. Expand SELinux Policy
4. Expand Memory Protection
5. Check "Allow all unconfined executables to use libraries ..."
6. Done!!

You may or may not have to reboot .. to be honest I forgot .. but I did reboot, just not sure if it is required.

Adding a calendar is pretty strainght forward after that as the default calendar now show up.
