I understand what you mean, but I don't understand why you say "it's impossible to arrange them". I suppose that you want the windows to be attached, and when one hides the remaining two joined together? Windows can be linked to another window or to a screen edge. But if the first window disappear there's no way to determinate where to locale the second one. Is this what you're looking for?

I thought that the easiest way to describe what I would like to see is to send a screenshot (attached). The calendar, event list and task list windows are, of course, on the left, with the sidebar on the right. The "before" pane shows my configuration of Rainlendar with two upcoming events and two upcoming tasks. The "after" pane shows how the windows remain when the two tasks are removed. The "What I'd like" is obviously how I would like both window configurations to show after the two tasks are removed.

As I said before, unfortunately, the sidebar is one window, and the elements can't be hidden individually. (they can by script, but it wouldn't be good solution).

About the left side, the todo list is linked to the bottom of the screen. And the event list is linked to the todo list. (and the calendar should be linked to the event list, but as you can see on the right side it's not, maybe they not "touch" when you arrange them. Also, I suppose you only remove the task).

Although you can't see the window, it's still there. And the event window is still linked to it, because its height isn't 0.

I will try to see if a script could be added to hide the window inside the sidebar, at least, until Rainy defines if an element inside a window is plausible to be hidden when the list is empty.

EDIT: I can't using a script get the number of task listed. So, I can't hide or show the task list inside the sidebar.

Yes, the problem is basically that if a windows such as the events list or task list is hidden because it contains no items, the other windows don't snap down. I imagine that this is because the hidden window is still there, even if one can't see it.

Therefore, as far as I understand it, if I want everything to snap to the bottom, my only choice is to use the sidebar. Am I correct? Thanks for your help.
