Thank you Kimmo. Enabling the above option has the same effect as adding a new calendar: gnome-keyring is started up. The daemon started at once I enable the option, and after that each time I start Rainlendar.

You have to enter all the passwords again in Rainlendar. If there is at least one which uses the OS specific encryption the keyring service will start up (the setting itself does not convert the passwords automatically).
