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When I try to refresh the calendar with rainlendar on my windows 8 OS, an error occurred with " CalDAV Error, The url ##### does not contain any calendars." But I can sync my calendar with ical on my MAC OSX with the same url.

Here is the content from the error log:

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Please run Rainlendar in the debug mode and send the debug log to me (use the support email address and include a link to this forum thread). If you have multiple calendars enabled please disable all the others so that the log will contain only the calendar which has the problem.

To cover similar problems in the future: how do I view the XML file directly so that I can compare the line number in the log and know which events might cause the problem?

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
