Definitely, I havent got it.

This is what I did:

I started rainlendar in Spanish, closed it, went to the folder where rainlendar.ini is located, made a copy of it and renamed the copy as ES.ini.

I started rainlendar again, changed the language to English, closed and repeated the process getting a file called EN.ini

Then I made a copy of the shurtcut that I had on the desktop and renamed it "Rainlendar ES" and in "Target" I copied

after the route of the program --config and the route of the new ini file, at the end I had: "C:\Program Files\Rainlendar2\Rainlendar2.exe" --config "C:\Users\Tombuctu\.rainlendar2\ES.ini"

When I click on the shortcut I get an error message saying:  
Unable to create configuration file:  
C:\Users\Tombuctu\.rainlendar2\ES.ini  
Make sure that the folder has write permissions

The folder .rainlendar2 is marked as read only, when I change this option it says that its ok, but again I see that continues as read-only...

Anyway what I dont understand is if the program need to write not just to read, in any case the program usually write on this folder. :S

Please, can you help me?

The --config argument wants a path to the rainlendar2.ini file instead the ini file so you would need to create a separate folder for the settings file. I.e. create a folder called "ES" under the .rainlendar2 folder and copy the rainlendar2.ini file to there. Then start Rainlendar like this: C:\Program Files\Rainlendar2\Rainlendar2.exe" --config "C:\Users\Tombuctu\.rainlendar2\ES"

Alternatively you can also make multiple portable installations of Rainlendar. That way each of them uses different settings so you can set a different language for each of them.
