This is beta version! It has not been tested.

- o Fixed a crash bug in Linux when new calendars are added with the wizard.
 - o Reverted the config folder back to the way it was before since the new system created problems in Vista.
 - o The name of the calendar is written as "X-WR-CALNAME" to the ics file.
 - o Removed blank lines from the ics file for better iPod compatibility.
 - o Fixed a crash bug on Linux network calendar when the offline file didn't exist.
 - o It is now possible to delete just a single instance of a recurring task.
 - o The ics files will always use CRLF as end of line mark.

Options menu seems to be fixed. For some reason the todo list sorting changed automatically to 'By Location' when I installed it but thats not a big issue.

I can't get the Google Calendar plugin to work. The log is returning the following message:

4:11:38 PM: Google Calendar: Authenticating...

4:12:41 PM: Google Calendar: Result: (7) 0 Unknown error.

Two problems I can think of: Am I right in putting my full google e-mail address in the 'e-mail' box (i.e. not just my username?) and does Rainlendar support a proxy server? I'm on a university network and unless rainlendar gets the info from the system proxy settings it could be blocking the connection.

Sounds great. This will be a really useful feature and given google calendar's functionality will open up a lot of possibilities for Rainlendar (automatically opening public holidays etc.).

I'm looking forward to trying it when the proxy is implemented fully. On that note, could I suggest an option to 'Try a direct connection if the proxy fails'? Some software does that and its very useful for people who switch between proxy/direct networks.

Also, what happens when the connection is not available? Does rainlendar keep a local copy of the calendar and update it when a connection is present or does it load everything from google all the time? Might be useful to have a local copy for those times when you can't get online. I guess it would have to synchronise both events added/changed in both google calendar and the local rainlendar file once the connection was found again.

Yeah you need to 'enable disk use' from the itunes options when you plug your ipod in and you can access it like an external drive. There's a folder on your ipod labelled 'calendar' and you can drop you ics file into it.

Hi guys,

Rainy, it's great work. When the google-plugin comes off beta I'll buy the Pro-Version.

But at the moment I found a few bugs:

- tooltip is hidden behind other windows unless rainlendar has focus or position is set to "on top" (behavior changed after I set position to "on top" and back to "normal")
- when I tried to edit a recurring event the calendar crashed (can't reproduce it). After this the event was copied twice to google (twice like two times every day).
- exceptions don't seem to work in google-calendar but we can't do anything about that, do we? :-)

The crash I reported above happend again: All I can give you is the German Error-Message (this is a pretty common one, I reckon, you've seen it before)

Where can I find the log to give detailed information?

Additionally when Rainlendar is refreshed (like clicking "Refresh" or closing the options-dialog) this error occurs two times:
Google Error!

Unable to authenticate to Google.

I sync three calendars with my google-account.

To me it seems as if google doesn't want anyone to log on three times in a row so fast.

I wasn't able to reproduce the problem with the tooltips. Does that happen always?

The Dr.Watson's log is written to "C:/Documents and Settings/All Users/Application Data/Microsoft/Dr Watson/drwtsn32.log". The file might be a long one so zip it and send it via email (rainy@iki.fi).

There might be some flood prevention in the Google calendar which prevents the simultaneous connections. I'll try to check if there is anything I can do about it.

Google calendar (and the Rainlendar's plugin) should support exceptions. Could you attach the event (as .ics file) where they are not working?
