This is beta version! It has not been tested.

- o Alarm time was calculated incorrectly for weekly recurring events. Fixed.
 - o Added support for urls in the lists and to tooltip.
 - o Tooltip can be left open (or kept hidden) by keeping shift key down.
 - o Added edit links to Outlook events. The links can be hidden from the settings.
 - o Added "Disable text formatting" advanced option to disable the wiki style formatting and the hotlinks.
 - o Fixed Outlook notifications with nested calendar folders.
 - o Added "DST" to <time> item which can be used to disable DST adjustment.
 - o Added option for safe uploads to the network calendars.
 - o Fixed a DST problem which caused some months to be shown incorrectly in certain timezones.
 - o Fixed window snapping in Linux.
 - o Added option to close the MAPI connection in Outlook plugin so that the message store file isn't locked all the time.
 - o Added option to poll changes in the Outlook and automatically refresh when events when something happens.

I'm trying to setup Ranlendar so my Calendar's kept in Google Calendar. I've got it working so items in created in Google calendar appear in Rainlendar and some items made in Rainlendar appear in Google Calendar. But it only seems that untimed entries can be written to Google. If I create an entry (or edit an existing one) with a specific start time, I get the following error:

"Google Error!
Unable to upload the event.
Server returned result: (0) 400 Bad Request."

I'm using the very latest Beta version of Rainlendar. Any ideas?

Another error (possibly related to the previous one). If I create a Google calendar event in Rainlendar (with a zero minute alarm), then delete it after it's time (by dbl clicking the entry and pressing the 'Delete' button), I get the following error:

"Google Error!
Unable to delete the event.
Server returned result: (0) 409 Conflict."

I can delete the entry ok before it's time though.

I think the conflict happens when the alarm is triggered in Google Calendar it marks it as changed and invalidates all the old versions so it's not possible to make modifications to the event until it has been re-read. If that's the case refreshing Rainlendar should fix the problem.

You're right, refreshing Rainlendar enables me to also delete the Google calendar copy.

It's good to have a workaround but it's inconvenient to have to manually refresh Rainlendar to work as I want - any chance of fixing it so I don't have to refresh it? Preferably transparency (so it just does it out of my view) or at least by getting Rainlendar to automatically refresh itself when it needs to.

However in the delete scenario I probably could reload the event if the 409 happens and delete it afterwards. I'd guess that if you are deleting something it probably doesn't matter if the event has been changed in Google calendar. I'll add this to my todo list.

1 I tried to connect Rainlendar2 with more then 5 calendars, but it always went back to the 5 calendars. It was also not possible the calendar: 'Default' to kill, so that I could install my fivth one. I haven'd found any possiblity to change that, so I edited the ini-file and changed:

Count=6

That helped - but is that the right way?:woohoo:

2 When I imported more than 3 Calendars, Rainlendar2 can't show any calendar items anymore. So I have to close Rainlendar2 and to start again - which is pretty :silly: .

3 When ever I change anything in Rainleandar, it looks like it would start again and the screen is flickering. Is that normal?:evil:
