
Rainlendar 2.0 build 26

This is beta version! It hasn't been tested.

There are some changes to the DST and incorrect time display issues. I'm not sure if I made things better or worse so if there still are events that display incorrect start or end time please answer to these questions and attach the event.

- What is your timezone?
- Are you using daylight saving time?
- What is the time Rainlendar shows?
- What is the time Rainlendar should show?
- If you set Options->AdjustDaylightSavingTime to false, does that make any difference?

The list of changes:

- 05 Nov 2006
 - o Fixed the Brazilian skin in the Shadow4 skin addon.
 - o Due date in the todo list uses the user defined format now.
 - o '%' -char got sometimes replaced with 37 in TimeFormat or DateFormat. Fixed.
 - o Fixed a crash when sorting the columns in manager.
 - o Fixed a crash when tray icon was removed from the skin.
 - o Start and end times were sometimes automatically changed when editing the event. Fixed.
 - o The ics-files can be now stored to a folder with non-ascii characters.
 - o Cancelling the import doesn't show error anymore.
 - o Legacy skins with foreign characters in the ini-file are not ignored anymore.
 - o Improved legacy skin support.
 - o Fixed few DST issues.
 - o Manager now displays the dates in the user defined format.
 - o DefaultAlarmFile is defined now with a relative path.
 - o Todo item priorities were shown incorrectly. Fixed.
 - o Rainlendar_ShowWindow() doesn't show the window if it's smartly hidden.
 - o Fixed a crash bug when dialogs were opened from a hotkey.
 - o Alarm set to 0 minutes will stay so also when the event/todo is edited.
 - o The languages should now work in Linux version too.
 - o The end date in managed was one day too far. Fixed.
 - o Some fixes to the window positioning in multimonitor environment with On Desktop setting.

Edit: Image was too big. The error stated:

The application failed to start because libcurl.dll was not found. Re-installing the application may fix this problem.

The interesting thing is, RL still starts up.

I seem to have forgotten to include the dlls to the archive (I was wondering why it was smaller than the installer). Anyway, you can either delete the NetworkPlugin.dll from the plugins folder or install the Pro version and get the dlls from there.

Could you check from the Rainlendar's log why it takes so long to appear. Start it from the command line and give --debug as argument so you'll get the full log. The log has timestamps which should show where the time is spent.

What is the time Rainlendar should say: Start 12.00pm, End 2.00pm

If you set Options->AdjustDaylightSavingTime to false, does that make any difference?

Yes, all events show correctly as far as I can tell.

It happens even if I type in those which is already on the list.

The time parser is not able to parse all the different time formats. You should be able to enter the time at least in HH:MM format (e.g. 19:30).

I thought I could just choose the nearest time and change the minute part (eg. choose 10:30 and change the minute to 45 for 10:45), but if rainlendar cannot parse different time formats, maybe it is better to just list out the time in HH:MM format?

Only a minor bug with DST but i'll mention it anyway:

Timezone: GMT

Are you using daylight saving time: Yes

What is the time Rainlendar shows: 12.00am

What is the time Rainlendar should say: 2.00am

If you set Options->AdjustDaylightSavingTime to false, does that make any difference?

No

This occurs only on the day when British Summer time starts (March 26th 2006, March 25th 2007 etc.). It doesn't seem to happen at the end of British Summer time.
