o Added support for Sunbird's alarm acknowledge property in the ics files.

i'm not sure, if this is by design, or its just a bug.
i consider this a bug.

i create a date in sunbird with alarm.
(thunderbird lighning is installed too and will alert too)

if the alert-time is reached, all three (sunbird+thunderbird lighning+rainlendar) pop up their alarm window.
(which is ok, because i have all three programms started, so i don't miss the date...)

if i click "ok" on the sunbirds alert-window, the rainlendar alarm-windows disapears (without letting me click dismiss or something else), which is *NOT* what i want. also, if i click on the "ok" on thunderbird-lightning, the rainlendar window disapears.

would you please explain this to me? i think, i'm technically aware, why this happens (rainlendar rereads the ics), but i don't know, if this is a good behaviour of rainlendar.

rereading the ics files is mandatory for me, so disableling does not work for me.

i recommend to let the decisions up to the user (a good default assumed).
in the advanced options let him/her choose, what he/she wants.

dismissing every alarm in rainlendar, which was dismissed in sunbird before is a little bit of annoying maybe, but it will definitely *remind* the user :-)

now, that i know about how rainlendar works with this issue, i will learn to work with it :-)

so thank you for implementing that feature so fast!!
