Launchy plugin for Rainlendar Posted by Rainy - 2007/08/10 13:55

There is a new feature in Rainlendar build 45 which allows you to create new events from the command line. This might not sound something that a normal user would be interested in but with a little help from a tool called Launchy this will provide an easy way to add events to your calendar.

Here's a quick howto:

- Get Launchy and install it.
- Copy the Rainy.dll from the attached zip to Launchy's plugins folder (C:\Program Files\Launchy\Plugins).
- Open Launchy (i.e. press Alt+Space) and go to the plugin options (use the context menu).
- Enable the "Rainy"-plugin.

After that you can enter something like this to Launchy:

Rainlendar will parse the given string and it'll create a new event from it.

http://www.ipi.fi/~rainy/stuff/launchy2.png

Note that the event parser in Rainlendar cannot do miracles so you need to keep the string well formed.

Start times for the event can be entered like this:

"12:00" or "10am" or "1:30 PM"

You can also prefix it with "at". The colon (':') is a must to separate the hours from minutes.

The supported date formats are:

```
"today", "tomorrow", "monday", "tuesday", ...
"20.3.", "3/20", "20 mar", "mar 20"
```

You can also define a time range like this:

"for 3 days". The supported range values are "minutes", "hours" and "days".

Currently the new event will be created into the first writable calendar that can be found.

Rainlendar will always create the event on the coming date unless the event is defined on the current day.

Note! This plugin works only with Launchy 1.25.

If anyone have not yet figured out how to interface Rainlendar with Launchy 2.x, here is how:
Using the runner plugin I have made two entries which I named "todo" and "event". Under program goes the path of the Rainlendar executable, "C:\\Program Files\\Rainlendar2\\Rainlendar2.exe" in my case.
The arguments look like this: For todo:add="todo \$\$" For event:add="\$\$"
Thus, there is no need for a Rainlendar plugin for Launchy.

It'd be cool if the command line for Rainlendar could parse something like one of the following formats:

- --add="calendar=This is my calendar event=I need to do this thing"
- --add="calendar='This is my calendar' event='I need to do this thing'"
- --add="I need to do this thing" --calendar="This is my calendar"

It'd be cool to specify category too.

Or the like. Although most would not want to type all that out to add an item, it would be easy to customize Launchy (or other tools) to make use of it.

I like the idea of making the Rainlendar command-line options more robust and not worrying about specific plugins when that's possible. I would think that would simplify the coding/testing because then Rainy doesn't have to learn a lot of different APIs. ;)
