Build 49 can be downloaded from here:

Windows: Rainlendar-2.2.b49.zip

Linux TAR: Rainlendar-2.2.b49.tar.bz2

Linux DEB: rainlendar2-pro_2.2.b49-1_i386.deb

This build includes couple of new features which might interest the Linux users. First of all you can now get the application in a .deb package which makes installation easier in distributions that use them (e.g. Ubuntu). You can install Rainlendar from the deb like this:

```
sudo dpkg -i rainlendar2-pro_2.2.b49-1_i386.deb
```

And uninstall it like this:

```
sudo dpkg -r rainlendar2-pro_2.2.b49-1_i386.deb
```

The second new Linux related feature is the support for native transparency. You need to have the composite enabled for the desktop (this basically means that you need to be running Compiz). I had to rewrite the whole window handling implementation for this so let me know if the windows and dialogs act funny (this applies to the Windows version too).

This is beta version! It has not been tested.

- o Fixed image position problem in the ini format skins.
- o Made the scanning of the skins recursive so it doesn't matter anymore how deep the folder structure is.
- o Added possibility to customize the todo list according to the task priority.
- o Illegal characters are removed from the offline file name.
- o The main menu was shown in the event and todo dialogs. Fixed.
- o Added native transparency support for Linux.
- o Updating a component multiple times causes conflicts in Google calendar. Fixed.

Further to my previous post, I've found that Rainlendar will redraw itself if I minimise a window that had been covering it but if I hover the cursor on Rainlendar instead of a window popping up showing details of the event it's over, the window doesn't appear and the part of Rainlendar that would have been beneath the windows disappears. This make it impossible to add, edit or delete any entries :S

A swift update fixing these problems would be appreciated.

Rainlendar 2.2 build 49 eats up Windows resources. After few hours my Windows XP became acting weird. Missing icons, buttons outside windows - GDI objects used by Rainlendar was 9999. Had to close it. Additionally, the Snooze sub menu for item selected in alarm window does not seem to work. For example, I snoozed (at least attempted to) one of 4 reminders and it didn't go away. I did the same for remaining 3 items and still had 4 topics in the alarm window. I had to hit the large snooze button at the bottom. Is this a new intended behavior or bug indeed.

I'm using the new Chromosphere skin and have the month calender in the top right corner of my desktop with the To Do screen below that and the event list below that (i.e. they're all down the right hand side). I also have the Digiclock from another skin appear in the top, centre of the desktop. I'm not sure what mean by 'transparency types'. This arrangement has always worked before and (as I mentioned), works with the previous beta.

Hi all and thanks Rainy, this seems to be a very nice update for Linux users. I still have some glitches, I will try to explain them (sorry I'm not into Linux Desktop programming nor a X guru, hope the information will still be usefull).

I'm on Ubuntu 7.10 (32 Bit) Gnome Desktop with full Compiz support enabled. If anyone need more specific infos (Advanced Desktop Effek Settings, Compiz Plugins, etc.), just ask. All in all it's a plain Ubuntu 7.10 installation with Compiz set to full. My Rainlendar settings are "On Desktop" and Transparency set to "Native" and I'm using the german translation (well, don't know if this matters). I installed through doubleclicking the .deb file. Don't know if it's important, but I'm using my own skin (problems seems to be the same when using one of the standard skins).

On a sidenote though: I had to unzip the contents of the '.r2lang' file and copy them to '/usr/share/rainlendar2/locale/' manually, if I drop them on rainlendar I get the message but they weren't copied. Maybe that's becaus I'm using the .deb for the first time (before i installed to ~/.bin/rainlendar2).

While using previous versions, I used Devilspie along with them, to keep the windows on the desktop. I stopped using Devilspie to minimize possible problem sources and this version seems to do what I want without the help of Devilspie anyway.

So, my problem is that i still keep losing my windows. From time to time the Rainlendar windows (calendar, even- and to-dolist) just disappear, while rainlendar is still running fine. I don't know exactly what triggers this, but one thing is, that everytime i click on the "Show Desktop" the windows are gone.

Most of the time I can "fix" this by simply clicking "Show Desktop" again and minimizing all other windows per hand. Still somewhat annoying.

My estimation is, that problem is caused by the way Gnome (or Metacity or Compiz) handles the window stack and or the window type (`_NET_WM_WINDOW_TYPE_DESKTOP`), or that Rainlendar doesn't meet their expectations.

Anyway, as said, i don't know much about this stuff and just speculating here. Another program i use - Conky - works, means it display itself on the desktop and stays there all the time, not flinching when I hit "Show desktop", etc. So it's possible.

Other programmes have problems with this behaviour too, here are two quotes from a discussion on the Ubuntu forums :

"i use (wintype "utility") because it's the most compatible setting: also tried as "desktop" but if the geometry is not

maximize and you click anywhere outside the terminal, it will disappear.
the drawback of using "utility" is that the "show desktop" will hide/unhide the terminal."

"when I hit "show desktop" button it is minimized, and so I have to hit it again to have the terminal maximized back again!
so if I want to get to the desktop I have to minimize each window alone! well .. for me I'm just too lazy to do that every
time I want to use the command line! any solution?"

After I downloaded this version, my Internet Security / Antivirus (NOD32) flagged the download (Rainlendar-2.2.b49.zip)
as a threat :(

"Probably unknown NewHeur_PE virus"

The fact that it says "probably" could mean that this is a false positive by NOD, (using its advanced heuristics etc to
detect unknown/new viruses), however I'd just like someone to confirm / look into this.

I forgot to add that I have indeed scoured the forums with this problem and DID indeed find the 13 odd posts "discussing" this problem :)

Now: Its all very well having being discussed before, but no-one as far as I can see has come up with an intelligent solution/workaround, thus being of any meaningful help. All the posts simply tell me: "its a false-positive by NOD", etc etc and nothing much further.

Furthermore, (no) I don't want to turn off my advanced heuristics feature of NOD, and (yes) I have submitted the file to NOD so that they "apparently" can determine that it is a false positive. Even if I add it to the NOD "exclusion" list, as one of the 13 odd posts suggests, NOD still moans about running a threat on startup...

My question is therefore this: Could I please receive a meaningful solution/reply? (eg) Is it possible to package it with something other than UPX if this is the identified problem? v2.2 b47 didn't have this problem with NOD, what was that release packaged with for example? :dry:

When I select "On Desktop" option an click in Gnome in the show desktop, Rainlendar just disapears.

Also with Compiz, the scale option does not show Rainlendar, neighter the Applications switcher shows it.

So far the only way I've been able to get the "On Desktop" feature to work in Linux is to set the window type to "Dock". But that's not a good solution since it brings the windows on top and it doesn't work reliably with Compiz.

So, if you can find an application that isn't hidden when the show desktop is clicked (with and without Compiz enabled) let me know about it and I can try to check how the feature is implemented in it.

I checked Conky but it seems to do the drawing directly to the desktop window which is something I cannot do with Rainlendar.

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
