I've set it up so I can use 3 "DigiClocks" from the shadow skin for the 3 time zones I want, but I've been having a problem with the analogue clocks.

I've found several analogue clocks in the "Rewind" skin (and not too many others), but it looks like changing the time zone isn't an option on the analogue clocks :( Are there any skins that include clocks that you can manually set to a certain time zone? I'm not bothered about how they look, I can reskin them myself so long as they have the functionality I need.

Alternatively, is there a way I could edit the Rewind skin so that I can manually adjust the time zone setting on analogue clocks?

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Your code is correct. Modified Chromophore works properly with my WinXP.

I tried adding `timezone="-5"` to the `_xml_` of the clock and then recompressing the skin and restarting rainlendar, and it didn't load the clock.

Are you sure your new skin has correct directories (x m l + images + scripts folders and skin.x m l in NewChromophore.r2skin or in NewChromophore folder)?

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
