Welcome to the forum, danroh.

By default, every ToDo list shows all the calendars.
To show 2 different lists you need to, right click on a window -> select Options -> Skins -> Advanced>>> -> On the right side, select one of the ToDo lists -> click on the Settings button below -> In the lower side of the dialog click on included/excluded calendars/categories.

If you have 2 calendars (ShortTerms and LongTerms) then you can simply select one of the ToDo List and include the ShortTerms calendar and then select the 2nd and include LongTerms calendar.

The "TO DO" list title is fixed. You can't change that, unless you use a skin which let you change the title.

When you say ShortTerms and LongTerms, are you referring about how many items the list would show?
This could be changed with right click -> Options -> Advanced -> Task list section -> future days the list shows.

But if you don't want to repeat items in both lists, you need to set a way to split those items.

Check how many calendars you have (Right click -> Options -> Calendars). If you have only one ("Default" by default) you will need to create a 2nd one (Click on Add... and add a new iCalendar format file or Google Calendar file, or... etc., call it "LongTerms" or "ShortTerms" for example). Another way (more complicated) is to create a category. So, you will have Holidays, Trips, Birthdays, ..., ShortTerms and LongTerms (one or both). Then you will need to add at least one category to each task.

Calendars have events/tasks. Each one has categories. You can show in the ToDo list only the calendars you want (Include) or show all but hide the calendars you don't want (Exclude). The same thing about categories.

You can have only the default calendar, and have an event list with only the birthdays listed ("categories included: Birthday, excluded: none")

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
