This is beta version! It has not been tested.

- o Fixed a crashing issue when the settings file was created the first time.
- o Outlook plugin should work in Windows 2000 again.
- o Added support for keywords. , , and will be replaced with the count to the current date.
- o A fix for weekly recurring exception in the Outlook plugin.
- o Windows were moved to the main monitor on redrawn. Fixed.
- o Included luaFileSystem library which allows local file enumeration for the lua scripts.
- o The time written to the edit field wasn't used on Mac. Fixed.
- o It wasn't possible to remove the category from a Google event. Fixed.
- o Changed the way OK button works in the event/todo dialog. If the calendar is not defined it now shows a message box.

Greetings,

I found a problem regarding alarms using Outlook plugin. When I create a task (maybe an event as well, I didn't test it - Edit: at this moment I've tested it: the same problem for events), e.g. at 5pm, and I set an alarm to 1 hour before deadline. I receive first alarm from Outlook at 3pm (2 hours before), then Rainlendar alarm at 4pm (1 hour before - this is OK). I think, Rainlander set his alarm time as the task time for Outlook, and Outlook add another alarm before the correct one. I hope you understand me:)

Another question - is it possible to disable alarm in Outlook, so that only alarm in Rainlendar is triggered? Or vice versa? I mean, I do not need 2 alarms at the same time (not at the same time now, but I hope it will be possible to fix the problem).

Can you attach the Outlook appointment which shows the problem? Save it as "Outlook Message Format *.msg".

The alarms can be disabled in Rainlendar from Options->Calendars, select the calendar and set the Suppress alarms to Yes.

Thank you for your advice regarding alarms. Do you have any idea if it is possible to disable alarms in Outlook? (I like Rainlendar alarms more :)) But this is not so important.

So, it doesn't matter which event causes this problem. Generally all events and tasks do. However I will attach the file. There is an event, date 2/10/2008, starting time 19:55 (I've tried it few moments ago ;)), alarm 5 minutes before the beginning. The first alarm was received from Outlook at 19:45, then at 19:50 from Rainlendar. The event was created in Rainlendar. I think that events and tasks created in Outlook do not do that.

Hi!
I'm using Rainy for Linux on my Arch machine. Since updating to Gnome 2.24 and gtk 2.16 Rainy isn't working. Sometimes it refuses to start, if it starts, then right clicking on it produces an error. Don't know is it Rainy-related or is it Arch-specific problem.

Rainlendar log file doesn't contain any errors, I could only attach gnome error report.

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
