
Installing language

Hi,

I have problems adding the German language in Rainlendar 2.4 (b64) Lite, in Kubuntu 8.10 (KDE 4.2).

It doesn't work with drag and drop, so I have unpacked the .r2lang file into the rainlendar2/locale directory and restarted Rainlendar, but when I choose in option the German language and press OK, nothing happens. When I start Rainlendar with --debug I can see the message "Error: Cannot set locale to 'de_DE'." and nothing more.

Also the option Position, On Desktop doesn't work, it is like On Top, which is the expected behavior?

Why does Rainlendar save it's config options in ~/.config/.rainlendar2 ? Why is that folder (.config/.rainlendar2) hidden, that is not standard. Could this be changed in a next release?

And a last question, the Rainlendar's Tray icon in KDE 4.2 has a white more or less big border around the blue background of the date number, this is with the default Chromophore skin. Is this a bug, can it be corrected?

Thank you for you help sausi. I have never used the 64 bit version, it was build 64.

But now I have a fresh install of Kubuntu 8.10 amd64 version with Rainlendar2 b71 64 bit witch works very well. (b70 has had problems with refreshing and the tray icon)

Replacing the trayicon.png file with a larger one doesn't help, it gets resized.

Testing with some other apps like aMule (which uses wxwidgets) I see that it has also the white background tray icon.

Rainlendar2 doesn't use wxwidgets, right? Because I found this bug <http://trac.wxwidgets.org/ticket/4810#comment:5> which says that wxwidgets doesn't use the native GTK+ API for the system tray (but now in trunk it does). Maybe you are using an old implementation for the tray icon? I think this because many other GTK+ programs don't have the white background in the tray.
