with RL2, this behavior doesn't occur, regardless of any transparency or desktop setting. best is that the cal is brought forward, but since the background isn't, it can't be seen. any ideas?

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Linux doesn't support the mouse hover stuff or native transparency, as you may already know. Copy transparency will take what is behind the window at the time of the load/refresh and use that as the back ground. If that be the desktop, then when you bring it forward you should see the desktop as its background. If I completely missed what you were asking sorry.

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yes, auto raise. it's a nice way to fake out a popup calendar by mouseover over a small part of it (i use the digiclock window)..

but 'he' led me to the answer; a refresh, whether auto or manual, will make a new background image with Copy transparency, thus ruining the original if there's a window over the cal.

RL2 seems to auto refresh randomly (or on an unknown schedule). not sure what a solution might be. is there a way to turn off auto refresh (other than midnight) and make it always manual? or always use the background at startup if cal position is locked or something?

this also affect multiple desktops with differing wallpaper - you can only use one of them. or is it ok to run multiple instances of rl against the same calendar files? that might solve that issue.

this would be ok, changes aren't that frequent. my only concern would be multiple instances read/writing the same .ics files.

on a side note, i actually think the old toggle for read or read/write was good. i'd prefer to lock all my holiday type non-changing cals; sometimes when adding a new event, the cal file picker will have a holiday cal filled in (doesn't seem to always remember last cal picked), which i would never want. although i would also add that the manager is a brilliant tool that helps find these sorts of errors.
