Changes:

- o Added icons to the menus.

- o RTM priorities were reversed. Fixed.

- o Outlook's appointments' private property didn't work. Fixed.

- o New calendar wizard now suggest a name for the calendar automatically.

- o Added support for an url field for the events and tasks. The link is shown as a clickable icon in the lists.

- o The horizontal and vertical calendars support weeknumbers now. The weeknumber is drawn on the first day of the week (use offset to move it).

- o Word wrapping works now for lines without spaces.

- o If updating an event to Google Calendar causes a conflict the updated event will reloaded from the server.

The server returns 200 meaning that everything went fine so I'm not really sure what data the network library is still waiting for. Can you run Rainlendar in the debug mode (use --debug command line argument or start it from "Debug Rainlendar" link in the program folder)? It should then create a file called RTMDump.xml to the backup folder which contains the data it got from the server. If you open the file with a text editor does it contain all your tasks (if you are not familiar with the xml format I can also check it if you send it to me (rainy@iki.fi))?

Thank you for a clue! I run the Rainlendar in debug mode, opened the xml file and then it was clear. The file was rather long and the last tag was unfinished - so I realized that it could be caused by large number of tasks in RTM. I have just deleted finished tasks (there was 95 of them) and everything works alright now.

Any idea why a lot of tasks causes this problem? What is the limit number? Anyway if there is no other workaround than to delete the finished tasks I think the user should be informed about what is happening...

Well, it seems after deleting those jott tasks that it made no difference. Now that it's mentioned, my list is cut off too. I only have about 75 completed tasks, so if task number is a problem, then the max is less than that.
